Old Business:

USCA Curling – Athlete Outreach Initiative

- USCA has created a signup
- An email will go out to our members, limited to 18 registrants
 - o 8:30-noon: clinic
 - o Lunch
 - o 2:00-4:00pm: Help with rookie league
 - Dinner something casual; not "donor dinner"

Senior Women's Nationals

- Level 2 Certified officials are needed; USCA said they can help with this
 - Classes can also be offered to our members:
 - Level 1: ½ day
 - Level 2: 8 hours the next day
 - Cost is \$125 per person; USCA gets first \$500 and club get everything after that
 - Action Item: Matt James to let USCA know that we do not have any Level 2 officials and inquire about recruiting some
- There is a free course on USCA for time keepers
- Signups for teams are now open until the end of December

Women Curler Development

- Ladies' Night update: went well; enthusiasm was encouraging
- Hopefully we have some momentum for Women's league in Session 3
 - General impression from talking to those present was that perhaps something less "regular" than a weekly league would be more attractive

Member-hosted Private Events

- A policy and potential schedule (likely Sunday afternoons) is being developed
 - Need to make sure we have someone there to close facility
 - Member would need to purchase the alcohol for their group
 - o Member would be responsible for ensuring all participants submit waiver
 - o Pricing would be \$200 per sheet for members who are also instructors
 - Event would be run like a regular LTC including safety talk and drills
- Action Item: Sharon Martin to draft email for review

Indianapolis Cultural Trail Inquiry

- Received an inquiry looking to partner with us for an outdoor synthetic surface "curling" program
- Action Item: Sharon Martin to follow up to see if they are looking for us to help staff the program or act as consultants/sponsor
