As many of you know, one of our regional clubs, Windy City in Chicago, suffered significant damage due to a fire in the building in which they are housed. They started a Go Fund Me page to which a number of our members contributed. The board of Circle City also approved a \$1000 donation from our club, which was made by check to avoid the on-line fees and provide the maximum benefit to our friends in Chicago. We wish them all the best in their rebuilding efforts.

Finally, I would like to exercise Presidential Privilege, if such a thing exists, in expressing my best wishes to Keith Hammer as he departs to continue his life in North Carolina. It has been a blast working with Keith to help our club achieve the goal of dedicated ice.
